 - Article 19- "Everyone has the right to freedom of opinion and expression; this right includes freedom to hold opinions without interference and to seek, receive, and impart information and ideas through any media and regard-less of frontiers."

 - 1954- Convention for the Protection of Cultural Property in the Event of Armed Conflict
 - 1970- Convention on the Means of Prohibiting and Preventing the Illicit Import, Export and Transfer of Ownership of Cultural Property
